Traveling Ministry Corps

The FWCC Traveling Ministry Corps has been up and running for a whole year now, making the first 50 visits across the whole Section, from Seattle, Washington to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and in Jamaica, El Salvador, and Bolivia. The second year cohort includes seven young adults from six yearly meetings in five countries in Latin America and four new ministers from three yearly meetings in the United States. They are all ready to visit Friends meetings and churches who seek an enriching and revitalizing opportunity to share their spiritual lives with these Friends who are deeply gifted and committed to supporting other Friends in deepening their own ministry. This year the training in Spanish was held at a Central YM Friends church in La Paz, Bolivia and the training in English was held at Pendle Hill Conference Center in Pennsylvania.



The 2019 Section Meeting of the FWCC Section of the Americas will be held March 21-24, 2019 at Lake Doniphan Conference and Retreat Center, in Excelsior Springs, Missouri, just outside Kansas City, MO, in the heartland of the United States. The theme will be ¡Come and See! (John 1:46) with explorations of "Who is my neighbor?" and "How can we all be Friends?" A main purpose of the Section Meeting is to facilitate an experience of the power of the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God, the Inward Christ, the Light Within.
